3. Update from Jo Andrews

Update from Mike Murray

- Met with Rupert Ward, KPMG Chair of Birmingham/Chicago Sister City Committee.
- Maybe at the next meeting we could Skype our counterparts.
- Has arranged a meeting with Sue Twells to progress a model developed to connect Birmingham schools to Guangzhou. This could be extended to America.

- BCC working with INLOGOV (UoB) and Chicago City Hall to develop a Masters focussing on city management in times of austerity?
- Has obtained a short promotional video produced by a BCU graduate who participated in the November visit last year (2013). The video highlights links between Birmingham and Chicago.
- Work progressing with social services- Birmingham, Chicago and Hamburg. They are exchanging best practice in 2014, to include safeguarding.
- The Lord Mayor is travelling to Washington in April for a performance by Birmingham Contemporary Music group in the library of Congress. He will also go to Chicago. National Express are also taking this opportunity to gain publicity for the company which runs the iconic yellow bus in 30 states.
- Work is progressing with Gary Forsyth, Assistant Chief Constable and Chicago Police Department around knife crime and community engagement.
- Met with Nick Venning PWC to discuss potential collaboration.
- Will invite Justin Benson, KPMG to the next meeting to deliver a presentation on behalf of KPMG.

4. Roundtable plus updates from:

Piali Ray – Chicago visit – 'A Tale of Two Inner Cities'

Anjum Cave – UKTI/British Council funding

- Suggests Piali look at potential funding through UKTI 'Passport to Export' fund.
- British Council funding for skills partnerships doesn't extend to the USA, it is only for Middle East North Africa (MENA) countries.

Lise Olson – Birmingham School of Acting, BCU – The school has extensive links in the States which could be drawn upon as appropriate for activity proposed by the group. Links include: NY; San Francisco and Chicago.

Further comments from group:

- Communication is a key aspect of our work and we need to design projects which people can link into. The Distinctly Birmingham (DB) website should help us to do this.
- Culture should link to business.
- We need to identify projects which have the 'attraction' factor for an American audience e.g. fashion – Kate Middleton or jewellery; digital or military.
