3. Update from Chair - Jo Andrews (Voices of War and Peace, the Poetry Foundation)

JA – met with Steve Bridges, Chicago Consul General in September and discussed the Voice of War and Peace initiative. Steve suggested that Kansas is better placed as a city to work on this initiative given its WW1 Museum and connections.

The Poetry Foundation link with a local Birmingham school has stalled due to a mismatch in terms of the age profile for participating students.

ACTION: MM & JA to explore an alternative route to set up a similar collaboration between Birmingham school and Chicago based institution.

  - a) Education:

HE – Jo Andrews (Roosevelt, De Paul and BABC)

- BCU has signed off an MOU with Roosevelt Business School. De Paul are wishing to offer internships, the DePaul Museum of Art are engaged in an ongoing dialogue
- BABC are holding their national conference in NY on 15-17.05.2015.

Schools - Carl Smith

• Rupert Ward has secured BABC money to fund school links between Birmingham and Chicago. \$4,000 is available to fund year 1, then \$2,000 in the subsequent 4 years. The intention is to create a body of work which could attract other sponsors in the future.

The intention is to organise Skype poetry slams; arrange other forms of writing exchange and explore other curricular opportunities. Turves Green school will be partnering with Hanson Park elementary school. A bid is currently being worked up and will be submitted to BABC.

JA suggested linking in to Voices of War and Peace.

SE suggested that Gallery 37 may be rejuvenated in Birmingham and this may present an opportunity to dip into further funding. SE also keen to find out if Rupert Ward had made contact with Julie Burros, Chicago's new Chief of Arts and Culture.

- b) Culture and Sport Symon Easton
- SE is planning to send out the proforma which was developed to capture international cultural activity across the city
- BRB still plan to go to Houston, but this is finance dependent.
- Links being forged between DanceXchange (Birmingham) and NYT2 dance project in Chicago.

    youth services in Chicago, Birmingham, Seoul and Johannesburg.
